After all if Puget Soundkeepers will sue a group of boatvards that only contributed .03% of all the copper dropped into Puget Sound imagine what they might do to you if you accidently hit the bilge pump switch and sent some oily water over the side. The fine could be many thousands of dollars and that could put a real dent in your cruising activity. Plus we also learned from the Gulf Oil disaster that dispersants might not be the best solution to the problem of oil in water.

Luckily for all us, our good friends at Z-Care have come up with what is pretty much an ideal solution to the problem described above.
